Background check will be completed and requires no DUI charges on the driving record. Specific insurance requirements for a personally owned car are a requirement for this position. Students must be 21 YEARS OLD. This site works with 7-25 year olds and students will receive extensive training to include Sex Offense Treatment Training, Mandated Reporting Training, Training in working with youth with Autism or Spectrum Disorder diagnoses, and an Advocacy Certification Training that offers college credits (not at UCCS).
