

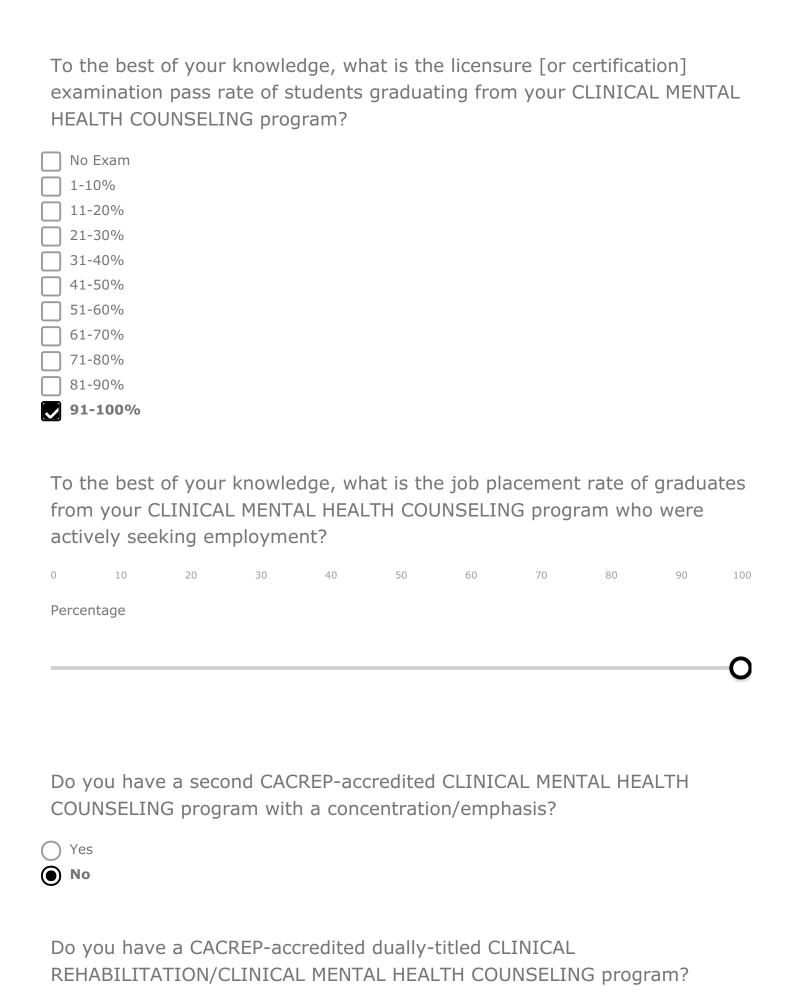



We run both two-year and three-year options for full-time students; a majority of enrolled students finish in two years

What is the formula you use when you calculate program completion rates?

All students complete a Program of Study form with their advisor in the initial year of their enrollment (first fall semester). In this process, they select either a two or three year plan and map out all required courses and electives per year and semester. Additionally, in their final semester of

coursework, they are required to complete a graduation application with the College of Education. Faculty advisors keep records of all students in the program and sign-off on graduation paperwork. If a student completes their program of study as approved, passes the CPCE, and submits a signed graduation application, they are considered a "completer" within the college and at UCCS.

The above question only allows for one response; therefore, we will add more context here. Unless the student is withdrawn completely from the College of Education, they are included in our completion rate data. We have several students that do switch specialty concentrations (e.g., CMHC <-> SC) with approval from the full faculty, or choose to step back and take a semester off due to personal reasons. They are still included in our overall numbers, and faculty advisors remain in contact. Students who are dismissed from the program or choose not to follow up with remedial recommendations and re-enroll are also included in the completion data until they are no longer listed as an active student within the college and UCCS.

What adjustments have you made to your program, if any, due to DEI requirements at your institution or in your state?

The Department of Counseling & Human Services (DCHS) has continued to strive for programmatic excellence and improvement within diversity, equity, and inclusion expectations across campus. Below are a few examples of these activities, and more detail can be found in our 2023 Self-Study Narrative (submitted directly to CACREP), as well as our 2023 Assessment Report (publicly available): (a) Faculty engagement in the UCCS Diversity, Excellence, and Inclusion Graduate School Development Grant program (b) College of Education out-of-state scholarships for new students (5-6 annually), (c) continuous offerings of both day and night cohort options to accommodate individual/family needs, (d) funding opportunities for school counseling interns via the Colorado House Bill 22-1220 (\$11,000/semester), (e) professional development, trainings, and collaborations with Disability Support Services & Facility Services on campus, (f) student mentorship pairings through CSI initiatives, (g) recent receipt (2019) of the National Center for Faculty Development & Diversity (NCFDD) award, (h) ongoing Campus Connection programming which pairs DCHS student mentors and at-promise youth throughout the community (& much much more!)
