SAHE Study Abroad Reflection: <u>Juliette Mogenson</u>

"To travel is to realize just how small of a space you take up in the world. Being my first time abroad, my eyes were widened with enamor and I found myself fascinated by the rich history of the three institutions we visited. At Cite Internationale Universitaire Paris, I met a girl who traveled to Paris to study law; she spoke of the cultural, familial, and personal challenges she faced along the way (like what food she was eating!). The adversity she overcame to simply reside in a foreign place was admirable to me because I hadn't ever experienced such discomfort. This experience pushed me out of



my cultural and personal comfort zone and by the end of the trip I actually felt comfortable being uncomfortable because I recognized that growth was occurring. It is important to reflect on one's own beliefs and how it affects their daily interactions with students. I will take the knowledge I have acquired about the role of student affairs in multicultural and intercultural contexts to advocate for what is in the best interest of the populations I serve."
