New Graduate Assistantship in the Office of Veteran and Military Student Affairs Beginning in Fall 2017

Dr. Phillip Morris, Director of the Office of Veteran and Military Student Affairs and Assistant Professor in Leadership, Research, and Foundations worked with Tom Dewar, Senior Director of Development at UCCS to advance the support for veterans with financial support from a long time CU donor and alum, Mr. Clancy Herbst. Clancy and his family provided funding for renovating and creating the new Student Veteran Center. Upon seeing the new center, they were thrilled with the outcome and were excited to be able to continue contributing to utilization and impact of the center. Mr. Dewar was able to secure the following sources of funding to help support veterans on campus:

Beginning in Fall 2017, two SAHE students will be hired to work as program and event coordinators within the McCord-Herbst Student Veteran Center to develop, market, and implement the programs and events associated with the Center. Students hired in these positions will receive \$8,000 per year for up to three years. In addition, one master's degree student in the Counselor Education program at UCCS will be a crisis intervention specialist and academic coach.

In addition to the funding of the Graduate Assistant position, Mr. Herbst is also providing funding to support tutoring, which will be another program specific to veterans that will be augmented with these positions and utilization of the new Center.

Thank you Dr. Morris for the partnership and finding ways for SAHE students to utilize their education and experience to benefit the retention and success of veteran and military-connected students at UCCS.
